Palmetto Coast Industrial Park

North Myrtle Beach may soon be getting a new industrial park in a rapidly-developing part of the city that officials hope will help diversify the local economy.

The proposed plans for the Palmetto Coast Industrial Park were initially approved by the city's planning commission a few weeks ago before being approved by NMB City Council in the meeting held on Monday, April 4. The park is a nearly 515,000 square foot industrial complex that will house three warehouse buildings when constructed.

Myrtle Beach Airport Unveils \$35M Terminal Expansion Hoped to Alleviate Lines, Crowds

Myrtle Beach International Airport is planning to undergo a major expansion, including adding a new security checkpoint, new gates and more food options.

Horry County airports director Scott Van Moppes shared details of the planned \$35 million expansion following a presentation at the county's annual budget meeting. The funding will come primarily from the federal bipartisan infrastructure bill according to county documents.

The news about the expansion comes after the airport saw its busiest summer ever last year. It added hundreds of flights every week compared to before the pandemic on airlines including Spirit, Frontier and United. The airport also got Southwest, the country's largest domestic airline, added to its list of carriers.

Intelligence Operations Command Center opening at CCU



The Intelligence Operations Command Center (IOCC), is an operational laboratory and briefing space. The IOCC is a blended classroom and briefing/conference room that features blue lights, collaborative computer hubs, six-screen international television news center, 12-seat briefing table, and 8-time-zone dedicated clock.

"The IOCC offers more applied activities and also gives students some sense of what it's like to operate in an intelligence facility, including the sights, sounds, and intangibles of the environment," said Smith. "We hear time and time again from our students when they're placed in the field that they're better prepared than their contemporaries because of their experiences at CCU. The lab is just one more thing that helps us improve the quality of what we're doing for our students."

CCU's Intelligence and Security program, which has 350 undergraduates, was established within the Department of Politics in 2012 and became an independent department in July 2021.

United States Economic Forecast

From Deloitte Insights

The US economy's performance in the past few months has been better than most people expected—or even realized. While Omicron took infection rates to a new high, little trace appeared in economic data. Inflation and related problems, such as tangled supply chains, may continue to challenge business leaders and policymakers, but the US economy is performing well by most measures:

- The unemployment rate is already back to the full employment level.
- The labor force participation rate has started to pick up, as some of the folks who left the labor force are coming back to work.
- Corporate profits are more than satisfactory. Profits in Q3 2021 were 21% above the prepandemic level.
 That's much better than many businesses had reason to expect when the pandemic first hit in March 2020
- Strong profits have supported business investment. The pandemic shifted investment away from buildings
 and toward equipment and information products. But the willingness to invest suggests that businesses
 are surprisingly optimistic about the future.
