Blue Angels test out skies over Myrtle Beach for first show in over a decade here

The Blue Angels are in Myrtle Beach this week checking out the Grand Strand skies in preparation for a spring air show next year.

The two members of the U.S. Navy's demonstration team landed in an F/A-18 Hornet, multi-mission strike fighter, at the Myrtle Beach International Airport Monday afternoon to conduct the site visit.

Lt. Andre Webb and Lt. John David Steppe told the waiting crowd of local officials and media they were excited to be in Myrtle Beach for the first time.

The team will be here through Tuesday to meet with airport officials and the FAA, as well as local police, fire and emergency management teams to hash out the logistics for the spring show.

The Blue Angels will perform in their six signature gold-and-blue F/A-18 Hornets known for their hard-charging demonstration of precision formation flying while pushing their aircraft to the limits.

Local Home Builders Association Launches Student Chapter to fill 60,000 Jobs

The Home Builders Association says 60,000 construction jobs need to be filled just in the state South Carolina and current builders are aging out of the business.

To tackle this workforce issue, The Horry Georgetown Home Builders Association and area high schools are working together to attract a younger workforce.

U.S. Third-Quarter Economic Growth Fastest in Three Years

The U.S. economy grew faster than initially thought in the third quarter, notching its quickest pace in three years, buoyed by robust business spending on equipment and an accumulation of inventories.

Gross domestic product expanded at a 3.3 percent annual rate last quarter also boosted by a rebound in government investment, the Commerce Department said in its second GDP estimate on Wednesday. That was the fastest pace since the third quarter of 2014 and a pickup from the second quarter's 3.1 percent rate.

The growth pace, however, likely exaggerates the health of the economy as inventories, goods yet to be sold, accounted for nearly a quarter of GDP growth. Excluding inventory investment, the economy grew at a 2.5 percent rate. When measured from the income side, output also expanded at a 2.5 percent rate.

"While welcomed improvement, the sustainability of growth has been reliant on pent-up demand and stockpiling of goods after grossly depleting inventories," said Lindsey Piegza, chief economist at Stifel Fixed Income in Chicago. Economists had expected that third-quarter GDP growth would be raised to a 3.2 percent rate. The brisk growth pace strengthens the case for the Federal Reserve to raise interest rates next month. The U.S. central bank has increased borrowing costs twice this year.
